QUARTERS FOR LAUNDRY WITH LOVE: This is an ongoing service project sponsored by the confirmation and pre-confirmation youth. Take one of the labeled pill bottles and as you get loose change, put the quarters in the bottle. When filled, bring back and place in the laundry soap container. We will periodically send the quarters to Church on the Street for their Laundry with Love nights.

ELCA YOUTH GATHERING IN-KIND OFFERING:

In the aftermath of a storm, hurricane, or tornado, New Orleans residents regularly find themselves without electricity. This quickly becomes a health crisis as people try to manage life in the hot, humid Gulf Coast summers. City leaders and community organizers identified the eight most-requested items to help residents as they wait for the power grid to be restored.

Our goal is to create 3,000 disaster relief kits filled with these items to help New Orleanians get through the days immediately following a natural disaster. It takes about \$100 to create an entire disaster relief kit. We encourage you to collect the items for your region or raise funds to complete an entire kit! Region 3 (our region) is asked to bring power charging banks. You may purchase these and send them with the youth traveling to Youth Gathering (by Sunday July 14th), or order them on the ELCA National Youth Gathering's Amazon or Target Wishlist.
